

Enrichment Classes Synopsis

Art Club provides students with an opportunity to improve and enhance their artistic abilities allowing students to explore new ways of creating art. Mrs. Johnson teaches students more advanced techniques in an array of mediums such as acrylic painting, sculpture, abstract art, etc.

Chess Club teaches the fundamentals of chess to our younger students. Advanced students learn chess strategies and more advanced techniques and compete in tournaments.

Future Athlete Training (FAT) introduces students to a variety of popular sports. The F.A.T. instructor emphasizes wellness and strength through physical activity in an assortment of indoor and outdoor sports.

Games Club is a forum for students to play award-winning board games that develop spatial awareness and critical thinking skills.

Golf instruction program teaches the complexities of the golf swing in a manner in which kids can understand and teaches these skills in the correct order that allows the player to "build" a great golf swing.

Kenpo Karate teaches students the basic techniques of self-defense. Children learn to focus their minds while performing the various self-defensive moves. This class will also include sparring with the Instructor and Junior instructors.

Science Club is taught by Science teacher Matt Masem and provides students in grades 1 - 5 an opportunity to conduct experiments and see amazing demonstrations that are not part of the regular Science curriculum at SEA, but are informational and fun nonetheless!

Sign Language (K-5th Grade) Sweetwater Episcopal Academy is proud to introduce a new Sign Language Club. Sign Language Club will be taught by Mrs. Brown and Mrs. McCracken. It is open to all SEA students in grades K-5. Students will be taught the fundamentals and culture of American Sign Language in a fun and experiential environment.

Storytelling and Production (3rd-5th Grade) this class will offer students the opportunity to delve into their creative selves. We will use written expression and digital options (such as digital cameras and flip cameras to tell our stories) This is a must for any student who enjoys reading and writing!

Swim Club (K-2nd Grade) Swim club is offered in the fall and spring seasons. The emphasis on swimming with Kindergarten through second grade students is learning the various swim strokes used in competitive swimming. This class teaches children these various strokes and works on their endurance in the water. Students must be able to swim using basic strokes in order to participate in this class.

Swim Club (3rd-5th Grade) Swim Club is offered in the fall and spring seasons. The emphasis on swimming with third through fifth graders is that the students must be experienced swimmers as this class will help lead them to competitive swim team (drills, endurance, expert strokes, etc).
